The city does not have the money for adequate upkeep, so for the fourth year the Adopt Elmwood Park group is tackling the maintenance and preservation of the park. We meet twice a month at 9:00 a.m. in the Elmwood Park grotto and do trash pick-up, weed, mulch, trim, whatever needs to be done to keep the park in good shape. We can use all of the helping hands we can muster--children too, if accompanied by an adult.

We will supply the yard waste bags and you can bring your favorite gloves and trimmer. We have trash picker-uppers too.

Need Help With Home Repairs?

Tome repairs can be time consuming and expensive. Doing them yourself requires expertise and can create a real challenge for the physically disabled or those on a fixed income. There are programs in the metro that can help. "A Guide to Housing Rehabilitation Programs for the Omaha Metropolitan Area" specifically targets older, low income neighbors and offers 39 different federally funded programs to help meet their home repair needs. UnderTheSink, the Douglas/Sarpy County facility located at 4001 South 120th Street in Omaha for collecting and disposing of unwanted household chemicals is open. **By Appointment Only** call 444-Sink (444-7465) during business hours. Appointments are being made at 15-minute intervals.

UnderTheSink will be open year 'round .. hours:

Wednesday from 9am until 5pm

Thursday from 9am until 6:30pm

Friday from 9am until 5pm Saturday from 9am -1pm

Appointments are necessary to avoid traffic problems on South 120th Street and to ensure that the handling of the waste is done under conditions that are safe for the residents, the staff, and the environment.

Materials that UnderTheSink receives will be reused, recycled, or properly disposed of through an off-site hazardous waste disposal contractor. There is no charge to residents for using the facility and residents may use the ReStore, where they may obtain, at no cost, leftover materials that are usable.

UnderTheSink is owned and operated by the City of Omaha on behalf of the residents of Douglas County and Sarpy County.
