The Omaha Fire Department, in cooperation with the Omaha Firefighters Historical Society, has taken over the city-owned building near 50th & Pine Streets and is working to refurbish it to its original state. The Historical Society's funding of the project sets it apart from just another classroom. Thanks to their financial support and vision, the restoration will include authentic 1939 firehouse doors and antique fire trucks and artifacts for display. According to Captain David Mann, the education center will be open to the public and serve as a fire safety education classroom for schools and groups. Watch for an AEPNA event there in 2012!

Because of good stewardship of Schroeder/Vogel Park by AEPNA and neighbors, the park was designated as a qualifier for Omaha Parks Foundation money for playground improvements. The city will match funds (up to \$50,000) raised for the project, so if you have an interest in improving the playground, please let us know. We will need members to help plan with all aspects of the project: the vision, the elbow grease and the fundraising! On Thursday, March 22 at 6:30 PM at Schroeder/Vogel Park, AEPNA will host an Omaha By Design Place Game to imagine improvements to the park. ZNETH

The first platinum LEED certified house in Nebraska is in our neighborhood. The Zero Net Energy Test House (ZNETH) produces more energy than it uses. Near 64th & Woolworth, the 4-bedroom 2,000 square foot ZNETH serves as a living learning laboratory for graduate students. Geothermal heat, solar panels and native landscaping may eventually take the home "off the grid", but for now it shows that sustainable can be beautiful.
