Two community-wide public meeting were held in May where attendees were provided an update on the CSO project and a look at potential solutions for the various basins. The project's overall goal is to balance the regulatory compliance requirements with economic affordability and community acceptance. While no final decisions have been made, the project is on target for submitting the initial plan in October 2007.
