Midtown Neighborhood Alliance awarded us a \$750 grant which will be applied to the Schroeder-Vogel Park project. We are close enough to the funding goal to start work. Pat Slaven, from the Omaha Parks & Recreation Department, and Amber Miller, from the Omaha Parks Foundation will attend our November meeting to give us an update and possibly a start date for the playground improvement project.

Green With Energy Efficiency Envy


